### About Our School

Lincoln High School is a 9-12 grade high school. Lincoln is known as a "Trauma Sensitive" school. The staff has been trained to work with students who have additional stress in their lives and teach strategies to help them cope and be successful in school. Our goal at Lincoln High School is to match the needs of our students with an appropriate schedule to specifically meet their alternative learning styles. Lincoln has a eight period day which provides opportunities for our students to make up two classes per year. Due to our smaller size, we provide a smaller learning environment with options for students to earn their high school diploma.

One of our belief statements is "All students can learn, achieve and succeed, given a physically and emotionally safe environment." By actively engaging our students in their learning, we strive to provide the most effective instructional strategies to enhance that learning experience. Students are valued as individuals with unique physical, social, emotional and intellectual needs. We acknowledge that individuals learn in different ways and we use differentiated instruction to monitor student progress and growth.

Lincoln High School offers assistance and interventions for students who are struggling academically and need additional support. Lincoln is Title I school-side and provides Collection of Evidence (COE) classes as an additional support for students in preparing them for passing the state assessments.
