SAFETY FIRST! Procedures for Afterschool Activities on Snow Days

If school is canceled for the day

No activities, including games or practices, will be held during normal school hours or afterschool when school is canceled for the day. If there are extremely unique situations such as a rapid improvement in weather conditions, directors and/or principals may contact the Superintendent to discuss exceptions to participate in activities after normal school day hours.

Factors to be considered when determining whether or not to allow activities to be held after normal school hours, including games or practices, include current and upcoming weather conditions, safe transportation by students, coaches, and spectators both to home and away sites, accessibility of buildings including sidewalks and parking lots, availability of officials and other game personnel and other safety issues and concerns.

The Superintendent will make the final decision regarding exceptions to allow afterschool activities to be scheduled after normal school day hours if school is canceled for the day.

If school is canceled for the day and the next day is Saturday

If weather conditions have improved on Saturday, Directors and Principals in consultation with the Facilities & Operations Director, Transportation Director and Superintendent, may elect to play games and participate in scheduled activities/events.

Factors to consider include current and upcoming weather conditions, safe transportation by students, coaches, and spectators both to home and away sites, accessibility of buildings including sidewalks and parking lots, availability of officials and other game personnel and other safety issues and concerns.

If school is delayed for the day

If the district has a two-hour delay, afterschool activities may be held, including games and practices. Factors to consider include current and upcoming weather conditions, safe transportation by students, coaches, and spectators both to home and away sites, accessibility of buildings including sidewalks and parking lots, availability of officials and other game personnel and other safety issues and concerns.
