- This policy will outline how families, school staff and students share responsibility for student achievement in meeting academic standards.
- We will give guidance as to how families can assist at home in supporting their children's education.
- We will hold family meetings at various times of the day and evening to provide families with more flexibility.
- We will provide opportunities for families to make suggestions and to participate as appropriate in decisions relating to the education of their children.
- We will provide families with opportunities to meet with the classroom teachers to discuss their children's progress.
