Q. Why do students in band tend to do well in school?

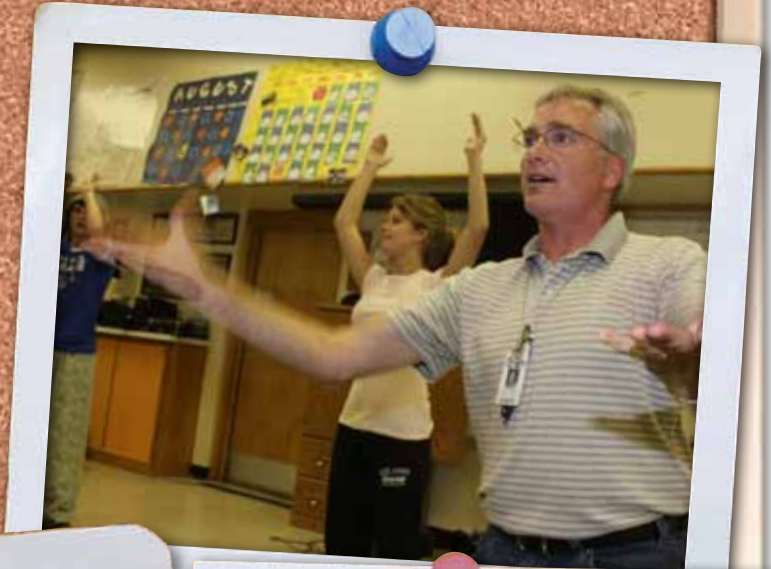
