Q. What do students in the Digital Photography course learn?

A. We have freshmen through seniors enrolled in this class. It is now a Career Technical Education course and it also counts as an art credit. We offer this course five periods a day.

As we have made the switch from film to digital photography, the objectives have changed. We talk about the technical side of photography -- like how to expose images and how to control exposure. But, we spend the majority of our time on composition and using the rule of thirds.

Q. How does this class prepare students for the digital age?

A. Film was a great medium, but it is no longer used on a large scale. It is mainly used for creative art projects. We are teaching students 21st Century skills. We are preparing students for possible internships or to work with a professional photographer or anything in the technical field that involves image manipulation.

Q. How has social media changed photography?

A. With Facebook and all the social media available to students today, it is fun for the kids to be able to use their images and show people what they are doing. I also encourage them to take artistic images as well. If students take a photo of their friend or family member, I want them to make it as artistic as possible.

Q. What other technical skills do your students learn?

A. We use Adobe Lightroom. It is a great photography software because it is designed for organization, manipulation and the control of images.


