Q. What are your students studying as we near the end of the school year?

A. We are working on poetry. This includes poetic elements, imagery, and all the other characteristics which make up a poem. The first activity we do in this unit is note taking. Students identify the elements within the poem and finally they write their own poems.

Q. How do you make poetry interesting for a middle school student?

A. Surprisingly, a lot of students like poetry. I believe this interest comes from music. Kids who truly enjoy music tend to really connect to poetry. A lot of students write their own music and poetry is another outlet for this creative writing.

Q. How do skills they are learning through writing poetry transfer to other areas?

A. Poetry requires creative writing. Good creative writing creates a visual image in the reader's mind. These skills transfer well to other types of writing such as technical writing. Many subjects, including math, science and social studies, require students to have good writing skills.

Q. How do you stay connected with parents?

A. I use telephone calls to make connections to parents. I'll often call to celebrate a success story. I will also call if their child is falling behind. Telephone calls are a great tool to stay connected.

Everyone is busy these days and that includes parents and teachers. If everyone who is concerned about the child is involved, including parents and teachers, the student will be more successful.
