Welcome to Walla Walla

Nestled at the foot of the scenic Blue Mountains in the southeast part of Washington state, Walla Walla is home to one of the nation's most fertile valleys. Walla Walla sustains a variety of agricultural crops - *most notably sweet onions and more recently, premium wine grapes*. The community that once was a stopping point on the Oregon Trail experiences all four seasons: bright springs and summers, spectacular falls, and crisp, moderate winters.

Approximately 30,000 residents make their homes in this diverse community. Walla Walla serves as the medical, cultural, educational, and commercial center of Southeastern Washington and Northeastern Oregon. The city is home to three colleges, modern hospitals, and is headquarters for the regional Army Corps of Engineers.

The community that once was a stopping point on the Oregon Trail experiences all four seasons: bright springs and summers, spectacular falls, and crisp, moderate winters.

Education is valued in our community. Whitman College, Walla Walla College, and Walla Walla Community College offer diverse, reputable curriculum. Cultural activities, including theater, museums, antique displays, lectures, and concerts, rival those of communities several times our size.

The Walla Walla Valley provides year-round recreational opportunities, including boating, sailing, canoeing, skiing, hunting, snowmobiling, mountain biking and fishing.

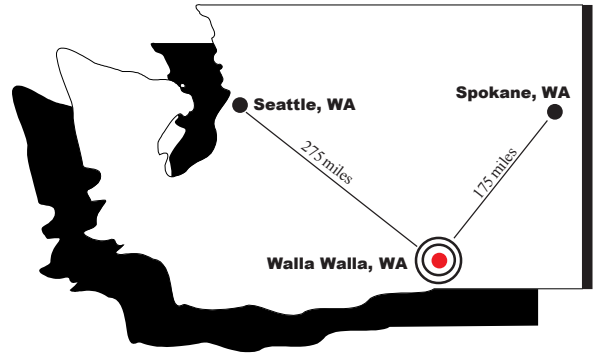
