We All Belong Here

Proven framework to address new legislation

During the most recent legislative session, the Washington Legislature passed SB 5044 requiring all Washington State school district employees and their school boards participate in one day of professional development training every other year beginning next fall.

Last night Superintendent Dr. Wade Smith shared Walla Walla Public Schools' intent to mold its required professional development around the already-established "We All Belong Here" framework.

"Focusing our efforts around our ongoing work will serve to continue promoting what we have collectively embraced and widely supported for the past five years," said Superintendent Smith. "WWPS recognizes that our differences help drive our greatness, and will continue our efforts promoting our diverse campus and classroom environments that are tolerant, respectful, and inclusive for all "

Spring 2021 iReady Data Review

Assistant Superintendent Gardea and Director Krutulis provided school board members an overview of Spring 2021 iReady Diagnostic assessment results. This spring's data benchmarks were compared to results from Spring 2019 since that was the last time students took the assessments in person due to COVID impacts. Last night's detailed report included historical norms, state data comparisons and subgroup performance breakouts.

Gardea reported he was encouraged to see the percentage of students on-grade level or above in Math and Reading exceeded Washington inschool population tested. There were more promising results in Reading as students on-grade level or above met or exceeded 2019 results in grades 3, 4 and 7. He noted more support is needed for Hispanic/Latino and Economically Disadvantaged students who are significantly less likely to be on track to meet grade level expectations. He also said the number of students 3 or more grade levels behind in Math and Reading increased.

Budget Update

Next month board members will approve the 2021-2022 General Fund budget based on enrollment of 5575 FTE. The budget includes new staffing and programs linked to federal pandemic recovery funds. Despite the new federal dollars, the district will spend down reserves to ensure programs are in place to address student needs. The budget meets the board mandated ending fund balance range of 6 to 8 percent.

Bond Update

Construction work at Pioneer Middle School and Walla Walla High School is in full swing and both projects remain on budget and on schedule. Wa-Hi Phase One will be completed by the start of the 2021-22 school year, with Phase One projects at Pioneer MS completed by winter break. Bids for the Lincoln High School renovation will be opened July 22 with construction beginning this fall.
