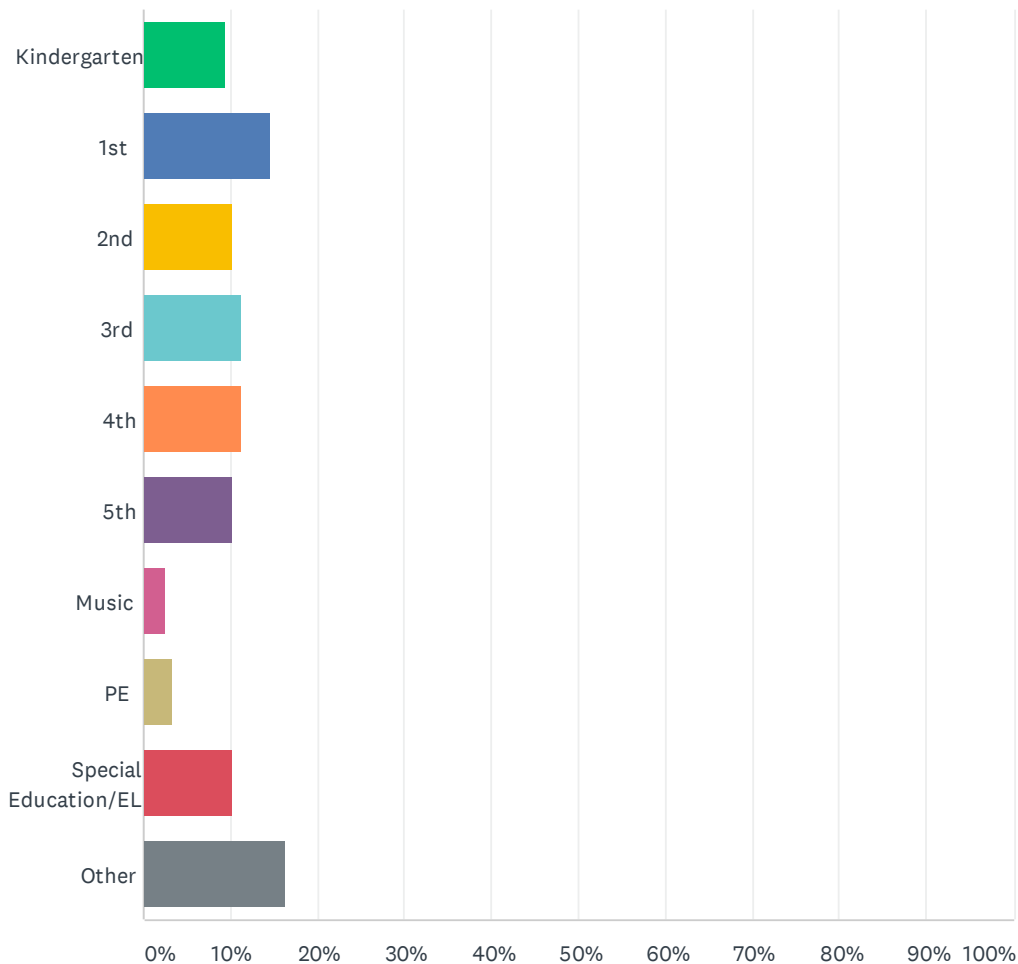


Q1 What best describes your current certificated position?

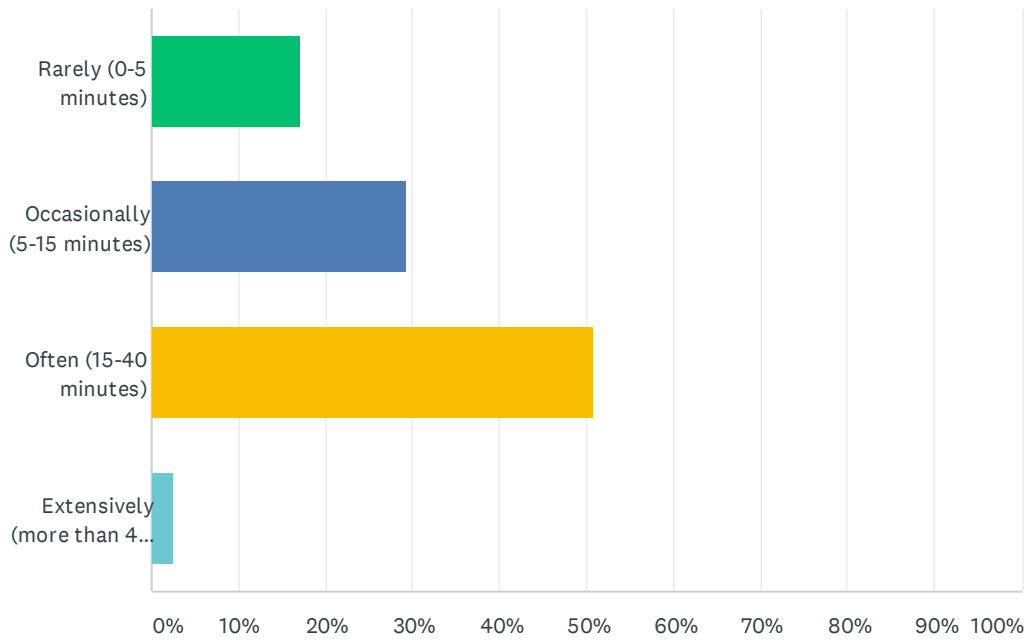

Q2 Prior to school closures, on average, how much time did your students spend per day on a Chromebook?

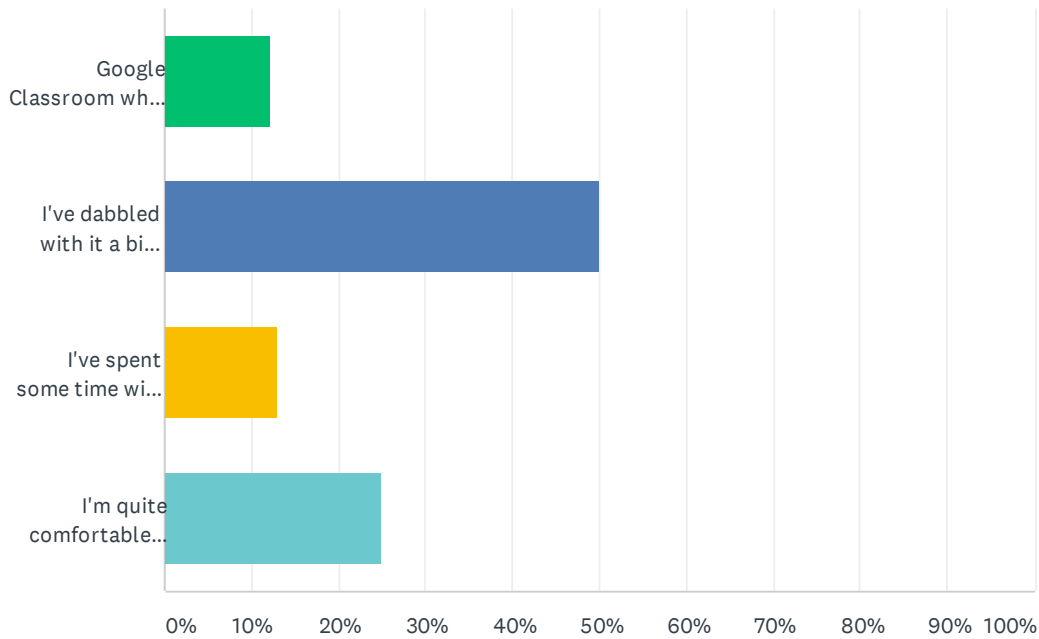

Q3 How knowledgeable/experienced are you as a teacher with Google Classroom?

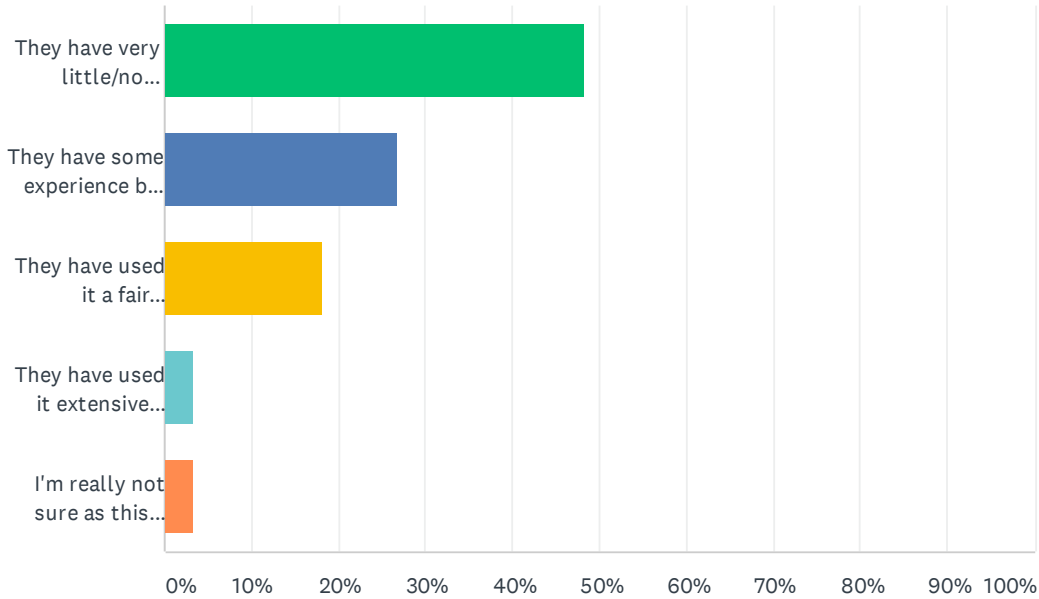

Q4 How knowledgeable/experienced do you believe your students, in general, are with Google Classroom?

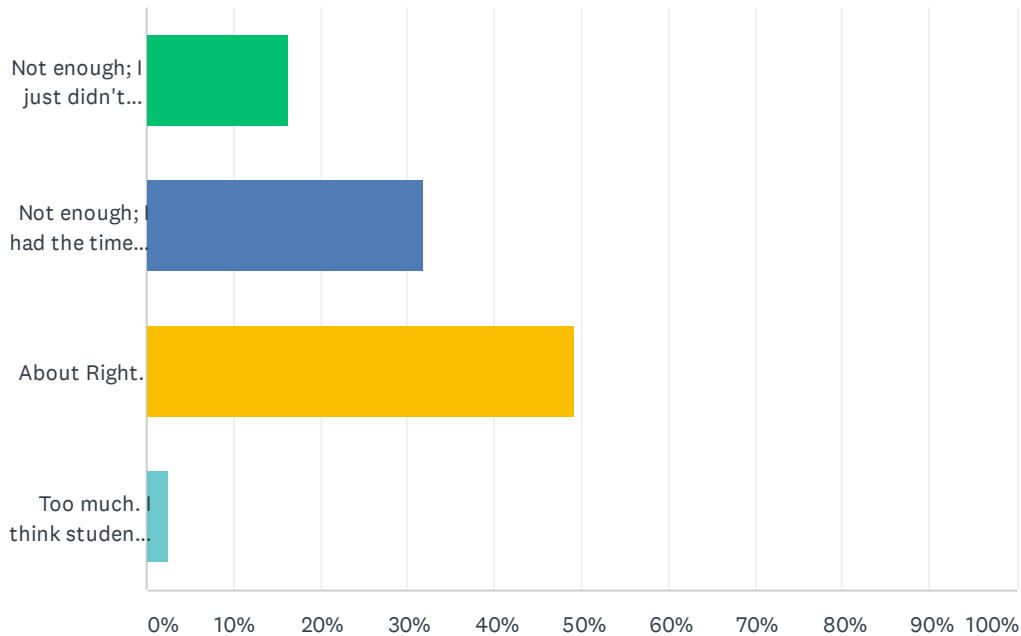

Q5 In your opinion, what response best describes the level of student Chromebook access/utilization in your classroom setting prior to campus closures?

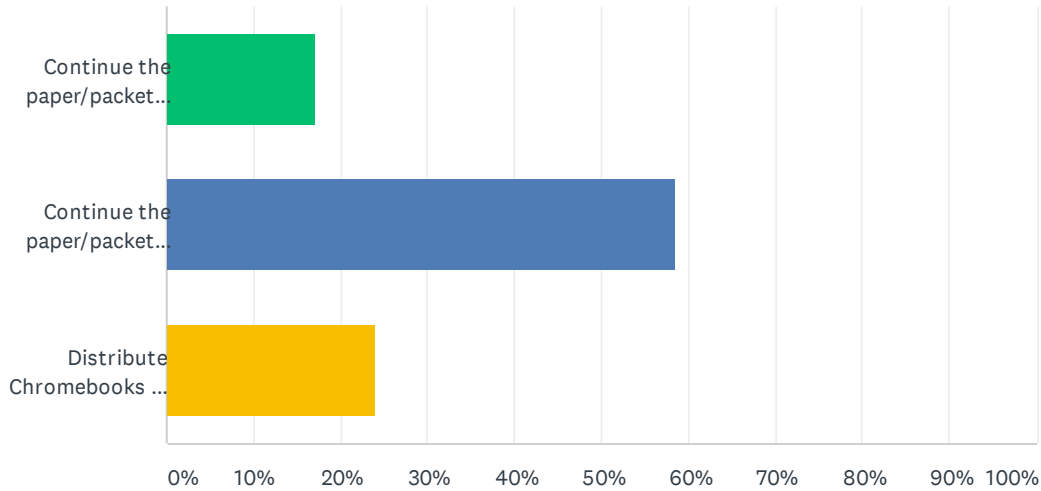

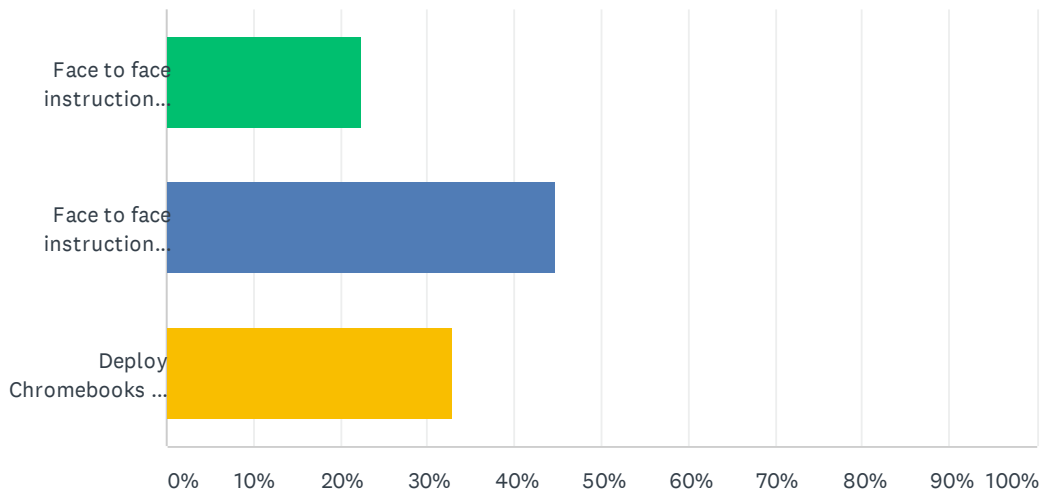

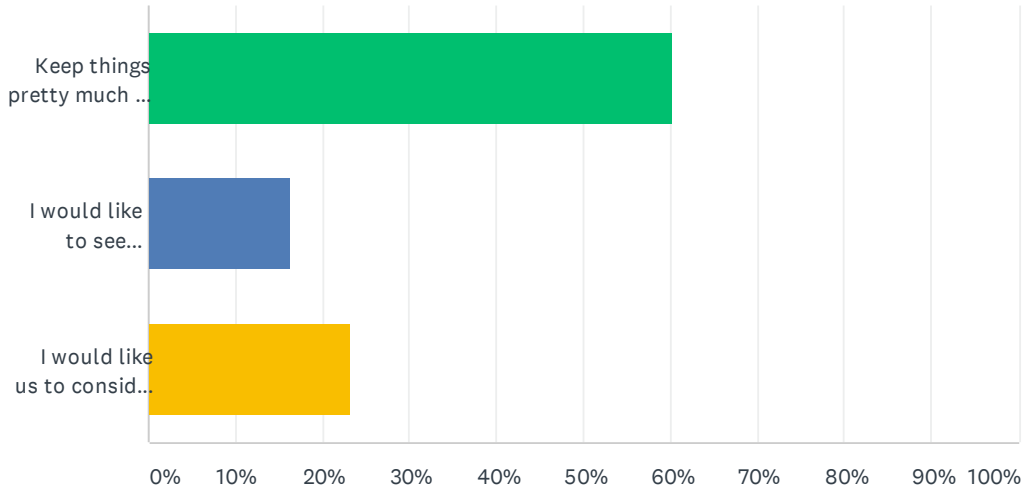

Face to face instruction during the day they attend and a take home packet for the alternating days they are at home.	22.41%	26
Face to face instruction during the day they attend and a take home pack with supplementary online instruction for parents who desire more content (Chromebooks and wifi hotspots provided to K-5 students who request).	44.83%	52

Keep things pretty much how they were prior to school closures.	60.34%	70
I would like to see Chromebooks and wifi hotspots issued to families who do not have access at home to support supplementary learning (Note: this may require us to have to reduce the number of Chromebooks available in the schools slightly).	16.38%	19
I would like us to consider the district go "1:1" at specific grades (e.g. 3-5), where every student is issued a Chromebook (and those who need it a wifi hotspot). Note that students would need to bring Chromebooks back and forth to school every day (or leave it at school when not needed to take home), as there would no longer be full classroom Chromebook carts available.	23.28%	27
