20-21 Budget Planning

School board approves spending \$1.5M in reserves to ensure stability

Last night school board members continued planning for the 2020-2021 General Fund Budget by approving parameters for Superintendent Dr. Wade Smith and his administrative team to use for finalizing the document. Among many planning assumptions (See below), the Board authorized the Superintendent to access \$1.5M of reserves to help maintain staff and student programs next school year.

Superintendent Dr. Wade Smith praised the school board for its sound past budgeting practices which put the district in strong

financial standing with adequate reserves to help soften anticipated budget shortfalls.

Superintendent Smith says that OSPI estimates and legistlative contacts forecast state funding dips will like be less drastic next school year but are expected to be more significant in 2021-2022. By statute a draft budget must be completed by July and must be approved by the Board in August.

New Social Studies curriculum aligned to state standards

Last night school board members unanimously adopted new social studies materials for grades 6-12.

The approved materials are aligned with the state's newly adopted standards and helps ensure students and teachers have access to the best materials to meet these standards, according to Executive Director of Teaching and Learning Christry Krutulis.

The process for adopting materials started in the Spring of 2019 and included the identification of WWPS essential social studies standards and a narrowing of materials to pilot to two sets. District teachers unanimously recommended Gibbs Smith materials for Washington State History and McGraw Hill materials for all other classes.

"Teachers were in the middle of piloting materials when schools closed. Their commitment to finishing the pilot and making a final recommendation while moving their instruction online was impressive," said Krutulis.

May 2020 Bond Program Update Walla Walla High School

- Jackson Contractor Group's framers completed the majority of the framing of the interior walls and ceilings in the new Science Building.
- Insulation was installed on the interior walls.
- Electrical & mechanical systems largely completed.
- The interior walls had drywall finishes installed and the exterior fascia was completed.
- The infrastructure package was started with new sewer lines being installed.
- New electrical service trenches were dug, the conduit was installed and trenches were backfilled.
- The design team and contractor successfully worked through several on-site issues arising from old sewer/water/irrigation piping being abandoned in place and not having been recorded.

Pioneer Middle School

- The Temporary Modular and Temporary Multipurpose projects were put out to bid to several contractors on the district's small works roster and bids were accepted April 30. Both were local Walla Walla firms (Nelson and Royce)
- Architects West and their design team continued working towards a permit set of construction documents.

Blue Ridge Elementary

- Wellens General Contractors (formerly Wellens Farwell) and local subcontractor Allan Key completed removing the dirt and insulation from the roof.
- Wine Country(roofer) mobilized on site. They prepared and cleaned the existing roof and began to install the new insulation.
