Applications are now being accepted for the AAUW Scholarship, established to provide assistance to women who have completed at minimum one year of college (30 semester or 45 quarter credits) and desire to complete their undergraduate or post-graduate education. Please note that there must be a break of at least one year at some time during the college education process.

Applications will be accepted from women who meet the following requirements:

- 1) They must be able to provide transcripts from at least one year of college, followed by an interruption (time lapse) in education.
- 2) They must be residents of Walla Walla County, Columbia County, or the city of Milton-Freewater.
