Retired Employees Association names grant recipients

Prospect Point third grade teacher Michele Briones and Wa-Hi ESL teacher Diana Erickson were recently named recipients of the Walla Walla-Columbia School Retirees Association autumn mini-grants. Each teacher will receive \$100 to help enhance educational offerings in their classes.

Briones plans to use the mini-grant dollars to purchase books that are needed for reaching the 50 point goal of the Accelerated Reader.

Erickson wants to encourage her students to use English outside of the classroom. In order to do this, she will use the mini-grant to purchase sets of books written in both English and Spanish so that she can pair up ESL students with students learning Spanish.

District still saving energy and tax dollars

It is the end of Year 5 of our Energy Management program and we have saved over 24% on usage and costs of our utilities.

We saved:

- \$169,000 or 28% on Electricity,
- \$24,000 or 14% on Natural Gas,
- \$64,000 or 25% on Water/Sewer.

This savings of more than \$258,000 would not be possible without the support and dedication of our staff.
