## November 6 • School Board Meeting Recap

### Board approves M&O levy election date

School board members approved Tuesday, February 19 as the election date for the 2008 replacement Maintenance and Operations Levy.

The voter approved 2004 M&O Levy, which passed at 67.4%, expires in December 2008 and this four-year Levy would replace it.

The cost for this replacement levy is similar to what Walla Walla property owners are currently paying.

### Summary of Proposal

**2009** - \$8,278,000 (projected rate \$3.42 per \$1,000)

**2010** - \$8,828,000 (projected rate \$3.56 per \$1,000)

**2011** - \$9,378,000 (projected rate \$3.69 per \$1,000)

**2012** - \$9,978,000 (projected rate \$3.83 per \$1,000)

### What do school levies pay for?

Local levies support school needs. Our levy pays for approximately 14 percent of the District's operating budget. In Walla Walla, the M&O levy helps to support:

- approximately 30 additional teachers
- approximately 50 additional non-certified staff
- school safety staff & technology
- elementary PE & music specialists
- health clinicians & library-media specialists
- elementary physical education specialists
- school supplies & building maintenance
- extra-curricular (athletics, music, drama, FFA and more)
- transportation for school activities

More information will be coming out to staff and the community later this fall.

### Parent Conferences this week

*No School Thursday and Friday*

Assistant Superintendent **Linda Boggs** reported to school board members on this week's fall conference schedule. There is no school Thursday and Friday.

Boggs thanked the teachers for all their efforts preparing for conferences. She said the introduction of *Online Grades* may have an impact on attendance at the secondary schools.

She said principals are closely monitoring attendance to track numbers. She noted with *Online Grades* many issues often discussed during conferences have already been communicated through *Online Grades*.

She reported Green Park Second Grade Teacher Martin Telstad is piloting an *Online Grades* program for elementary teachers. Boggs said she expects elementary schools to offer *Online Grades* next school year. Parents are asked to check with their child's school for a conference schedule.

### Agencies team with district to curb truancy

Garrison Principal **Gina Yonts**, Wa-Hi Assistant Principal **Matt Bona** and Lincoln Alternative High School Intervention Specialist **Brooke Bouchey** briefed school board members on the district's Inter-agency Truancy Committee.

Yonts said the committee is working with the same message -- "truancy hurts everyone." The committee is designed to bring agencies together to help keep students in school.

A regional luncheon was held recently to discuss the Becca Bill, share data, improve communications and develop action plans.
