Refinancing of bonds to save thousands

Move expected to save taxpayers \$400,000

Board members last night took the first step to save taxpayers an estimated \$400,000 by refinancing existing district bonds.

Interim Business Manager **Pat Johnston** said low interest rates make the timing right to refinance. Seattle Northwest Securities is assisting the district throughout this two month process. Johnston said there are several steps the district must complete before the bonds get new, lower interest rates.

C.A.S.T program hinges on teamwork

Elementary teachers, specialists and principals now have a “running record” of each student thanks to the Collaborative Academic Support Team or C.A.S.T.

Last night Berney Elementary Principal **David Talley** and School Psychologist **Maria Garcia** updated the school board on the program designed to improve the information sharing process.

Talley praised the work of District Assessment Director **Ron Higgins** and District Math Director **Chris Gardea** for developing a dynamic database that groups the vast assessment data into one source. Talley said this tool is key to the successful program.

The database also has a “note” function so narrative information on each child’s needs can be documented and shared with teachers and support specialists.

Talley said all elementary schools are using the system and have dedicated time each month to use the program. The data helps schools develop programs to meet the needs of at risk students via group interventions.

Telephone notification system update

Communications Director **Mark Higgins** and Technology Director **Janis Barton** provided the school board a mid-year progress report on the district’s new telephone notification system.

The notification system was introduced to offer more school information to parents and staff. The district is also capable of sending out instant notifications in case of emergencies or during school closures.

Feedback on the district’s new telephone notification service for parents and staff has generally been very positive according to Higgins. He noted the system has not been perfect and there is room for improvement.

Long delays before a message is played or no message at all is the most significant issue, he said. The district has been working with US NetCom to troubleshoot technical problems and to develop information for parents and staff on how to better use the system.

Suggestions to improve service

- Look for US NetCom Caller ID Telephone Number: 417-782-1996 (some ID systems read - Missouri)
- Always say hello (This system is VOICE activated)
- Give the system a few seconds to play message
- If possible, set answering machine to pick up on the 5th ring (It won’t leave a message if set to 6th ring or more — also clear message box to ensure there is enough space)
- If you miss a message, call 417-782-1996 to retrieve
- Contact school secretary to report problems
