

Pioneer P.O.W.E.R team promotes school pride

Pioneer Principal Dana Jones, Assistant Principal Kim Doecker and Counselor Angie Gardea were joined by several students last night to explain the school's P.O.W.E.R. team.

Students are selected by teachers for the program and then must complete an application process to join the team.

Doecker reported discipline referrals have dropped 17 percent since the program's inception..

The program promotes the core principles of:

Pride: Students take pride in themselves and others.

Ownership: Students take ownership in their actions.

Warmth: Students create a warm school community

Encouragements: Students encouraged to set goals

Respect: Students respect themselves and others

School board authorizes district application for snow days waiver

School board members last night authorized the district to submit an application to the state for a waiver to excuse the four snow days missed as a result of this winter's record storms.

This school board action provides the district more options. No decisions were made last night on how or if the waiver would be used if approved.

The district could excuse all four days, some of the days or none of the days at all. The waiver will be reviewed by the Office of the State Superintendent of Public Instruction. The district hopes to have an answer within the next week.

School board members are expected to make a decision at the next school board meeting -- Tuesday, February 17.

Extending the school year provides challenges for the district, most notably the possibility of changing the Walla Walla High School graduation date.

Reforestation project teams Walla Walla Public Schools with City and Rotary Club to plant trees in our community

Walla Walla Public Schools has teamed with the City of Walla Walla and Rotary Club of Walla Walla to plant trees on school grounds and for families to plant at their residence sidewalk "right of ways." Trees may also be planted in the county.

Approximately 300 to 400 trees will be available for planting beginning mid-March. The trees will be used for science lessons featuring students planting trees at school or at home. The project will serve as a way for students to learn more about trees in the Walla Walla Valley. School parent nights will also be held to offer give away activities for families to plant trees at their homes near sidewalk "right of ways." Some of the trees will also be used to improve school campuses.
