#### I-728 Public Forum

Tuesday evening Walla Walla Public Schools conducted its annual I-728 Public Forum to seek public input in the development of an operational plan.

I-728 was approved by the Washington voters in November 2000 to provide school districts additional funding to lower class size and support learning efforts for all students. I-728 funding has been suspended and may continue to be suspended as a result of the 2011 Legislative session. If legislators had not suspended the funding and payment levels were distributed as intended by the voters in 2000, Walla Walla Public Schools would have received \$2.9 million for the 2011-12 school year.

"Public education has contributed greatly during this economic recession," Superintendent **Mick Miller** said. "Funding for I-732 for staff cost of living increases has also been suspended."
