## Wa-Hi survey findings now available for public view

Walla Walla Public Schools partnered with Washington State University Social and Economic Sciences Research Center to conduct a telephone survey to determine opinions about facility improvement priorities for Walla Walla High School.

These results are now posted on the district web site: <u>www.wwps.org</u>. WSU representatives made calls in June and connected with 308 community members as part of this scientific survey process. The district also conducted an online survey in June to obtain additional community input.

The February 12, 2013 bond proposal to modernize Walla Walla High School failed garnering a 53.30 percent YES vote. The proposal required a 60 percent "Supermajority" for approval. The bond proposal was for \$48 million. The total project cost was \$69.6 million.

## **General Fund Budget Update**

The school board held a public work session Tuesday afternoon to review the district's preliminary 2013-14 General Fund budget. The \$66 million budget maintains a 10 percent fund balance reserve. The budget is based on enrollment of 6117 K-12 FTE students. This number is up from last year since the state is funding a full FTE for all day kindergarten at Edison and Sharpstein this year. ## District helps fund Orchard Street lighting project

School board members unanimously voted to fund \$10,000 to Walla Walla County for street light as part of the Orchard Street improvement project.

The district funds will help pay for nine LED street lights. School Board president Anne Golden said the Orchard St. project is operating on a tight budget and funds were not available for the street light phase.

School board members said the safety of students getting to and from school justified the expenditure. The district has a long-standing partnership with the City of Walla Walla and Walla Walla County on school zone safety projects. The Orchard St. project will be completed in August.

**JROTC Rifle Team wins Jr. Olympics National title** The Walla Walla High School JROTC Wa-Hi Rifle Team topped 37 teams from around the country to win the Junior Olympic Three Position Air Rifle National Title.

The Walla Walla High School team of Cadet Captain Caitlyn Lasseigne, Cadet Staff Sergeant Sarah Jameson, Cadet Staff Sergeant Allison Juergensen and Cadet Staff Sergeant Andrew Jenkins defeated last year's national championship team Sutter Union High School of California in the competition's final round. The event was held in Anniston, AL.
