District to study 1:1 Technology options

Initiative focuses personal devices for students

Assistant Superintendent Dr. Linda Boggs and Technology Director Forrest Baker reported to school board members last night on planning efforts to develop a WWPS 1:1 Technology Initiative which hinges on personal electronic devices for students and curriculum delivered electronically.

Boggs and Baker visited the Vail School District in Tucson, AZ during the winter to learn how its schools have embraced this concept. The process in Walla Walla will start with the establishment of an internal Technology Task Force. This group will help develop a vision for the project.

Boggs and Baker revealed a Top 10 list of areas to address in order for this initiative to gain traction. Funding, professional development and content management of curriculum are critical elements of this list, according to last night's report.

Baker said the Technology Task Force will serve in an advisory role. He expects approximately nine to 14 meetings within a year, meeting monthly. He said some sub-committees may meet outside of this schedule.

All six elementary schools participated as well as an All-Star team of elementary principals who competed during a warm up exhibition round, according to the report.

About the Battle of the Books: This is an activity all 4th and 5th grade students participate in during library time. Teams of students from each class read the 20 Washington Children's Choice Picture Book Award nominees. After reading the books, the students take notes on the literary elements of the books, identify genre and other distinctive text features.

Each class has a quiz show type battle to determine a class champion. The classroom winners proceed to an all school battle. The school champion then represents their school in the All-City competition. This year's battle was held April 2 at the Sharpstein Gym.

Whitman research project focuses on INK-OUT and Health Center

Whitman College student researchers in Professor Paul Apostolidis' Politics Department reported to school board members on the INK-OUT program and The Health Center which has clinics at Lincoln High School and Blue Ridge Elementary. These Whitman students conducted interviews, reviewed policies and legislation as part of the project.

The INK-OUT study was part of the State of State for Washington Latinos. Recommendations include more awareness of the gang lifestyle and how it impacts learning, mental health and creates barriers to success. The Health Center study encourages legislative changes to allow billing of insurance companies for service and supporting awareness efforts.
