# Gardea earns regional distinguished honors

Prospect Point Elementary Principal Chris Gardea was recently selected Distinguished Elementary Principal for the Lake Wallula Region for 2014. Assistant Superintendent Laure Quaresma presented his award last night.

Gardea is now eligible for the National Distinguished Principal award to be decided next Fall. Gardea has been Principal at Prospect Point since 2008.

Nominators said Chris Gardea has demonstrated integrity, leadership and a commitment to children. His nominators

# **Walla Walla Charter School**

Pioneer Middle School teacher Dan Calzaretta reported to the school board last night his plan to start a Charter School in Walla Walla. He will spend next year planning for Willow Public Charter School for middle school students in grades 6-8.

Calzaretta has received a Fellowship Grant to provide funding for planning in anticipation of a September 2016 opening date. Calzaretta said he plans to target students who are not successful in the traditional school setting by offering smaller school class sizes and project based learning opportunities.

In November 2012, Washington voters approved Initiative 1240 which allows up to 40 public charter schools to be opened over a five-year period. Willow would be the first public charter school in Walla Walla.
