Minutes from the April 19, 2016 board meeting, personnel report, out-of-state travel, extracurricular athletic contracts, May 3 accounts payable and April payroll, and Resolution 03-2016 Delegating Authority to WIAA 2016-17.

### **Budget/Enrollment update**

Executive Director of Business Services Ted Cohan reported state revenue formulas are in as work continues on the 2016-2017 budget. Enrollment is 105 FTE over targets.

### **Energy Management Program**

Energy Management Coordinator John Butenhoff provided an update last night. The program is in its 16th year and has helped the district save \$5 million. Utility costs continue to rise, but usage is down.

### **High School Graduation**

School board members held a public work session to discuss Policy 2410 - High School Graduation Requirements. This year's 7th graders will need 24 credits to graduate.

### **Trauma Informed Practices**

Board members held a public work session to discuss the implementation of trauma informed practices. Relationships are critical to improved behavior and student achievement, according to the panel.
