



Enrollment update: First official count for school year is Thursday

The first official enrollment count of the school year is set for Thursday, Sept. 8. Tuesday night Executive Director of Business Services Ted Cohan reported to the school board the district will have official enrollment figures later this week. He said he did not want to speculate enrollment counts at this time since the information is not complete. He reminded school board members the September enrollment count will not include Running Start or Alternative Education Program students since these programs do not start until later this month and will be captured in October's report. Cohan did say the district's kindergarten numbers appear to have bounced back from a dip last year. The district based its General Fund Budget on an enrollment count of 5760 FTE students, up 50 from last year's target.

School Board directs program study



Assistant Superintendent Gardea to facilitate committee's work

Assistant Superintendent Chris Gardea is leading the School Board directed Highly Capable Program Recommendation Committee (HCC). This group is comprised of parents, teachers, principals, a School Board Member (non-voting), the Executive Director for Teaching and Learning, and the Superintendent. Teachers interested in serving on the committee are encouraged to complete an application by Sept. 23 via the district's Highly Capable webpage. The HCC will complete the work necessary to provide Kindergarten through twelfth grade program recommendation to the Board of Directors May 2, 2017, to be considered for implementation beginning the 2017-18 school year.

The Committee is tasked with the following charge:

- Review the history of the Highly Capable Program in WWPS
- Review applicable state and federal laws, requirements, and mandates
- Review the current model being offered in Walla Walla Public Schools
- Review the 2015-16 outside consultant and committee work
- Perform additional study and research as may be required
- Provide multiple opportunities for parent, stakeholder, and staff input

The committee's recommendation must:

- be financially sustainable and programmatically feasible
- be research-based to best support the needs of highly capable students
- provide a scaffold program, supporting K-12 grade alignment
