New teacher mentoring program offers support for beginning educators

The Beginning Educator Support Team or BEST is helping new teachers make a successful transition to their new careers, according to a report last night from Erin Dorso, program coordinator for Teacher Induction and Mentoring. Dorso said teacher induction at Walla Walla Public Schools strives to provide a comprehensive, coherent, and sustained support system for beginning educators and guide them into a lifetime of teaching and learning.

Teacher Induction Program Goals:

- 1. Reduce teacher turnover
- 2. Improve teacher quality for student learning
- 3. Ensure equity of learning opportunity for all students
- 4. Help build a diverse teaching force

A key element of the program is linking beginning teachers with experienced mentor


Resolution 04-2018
