

Summer Sol Review

Superintendent Dr. Wade Smith reported the district wanted to do everything in its power to help students recover from the pandemicimpacted 2020-2021 school year. This included offering an unprecedented summer learning program, Summer




Sol, for all students utilizing a 3-tiered approach.1. Targeted Accelerated Learning (early morning).2. Enrichment for all (mid-morning).3. Leveraging Community Partners (afternoon).

Director of Accelerated Learning & Support Brent Cummings directed Summer Sol which served 1519 students, or nearly 1/3 of the district's student population. Summer Sol was offered twice during the summer in two, four-week blocks at all school buildings.

Cummings reported there were some signs of academic improvement for participants in the Targeted Accelerated Learning program, particularly in math. Special education students and English Language Learners witnessed the most academic improvement.

Cummings said the robust morning acceleration model implemented last summer is likely not repeatable, noting the difficulty obtaining sufficient staffing and the importance that teachers take time off

BUDGET/ENROLLMENT

Fiscal Services Director Nancy Taylor reported revenues and expenditures for October are in alignment with projections. Enrollment remains 75 FTE under beginning year budget projections. This has improved since the beginning of the year when the district was 150 FTE off budget targets. Taylor has made adjustments to this year's budget to reflect the funding short falls from the postpandemic enrollment decline.

Bond Update

Superintendent Dr. Wade Smith provided school board members an update on bond projects. Staff and students will be moving into completed Phase One projects at Pioneer Middle School following winter break. This is a major milestone as the renovated 1950's gym, new locker rooms, new auxiliary gym/fitness center, new entry addition, new cafeteria and renovated 1950's wing and classroom addition are nearly finished. Some "punch list" items in these areas will remain, but the spaces will be in use. Phase Two projects at Pioneer, which include additions to the main building for science and art classrooms, begin this winter. The project will be completed by the start of the 2022-2023 school year.

The updated and expanded Walla Walla High School Commons will open to staff and students in mid-January. Construction continues on the main academic building renovation. Progress continues on the 1927 Lincoln High School renovation. This project will be completed by September 2022 or earlier depending on phasing.
