# **High School test scores top state**

District Assessment Coordinator **Maria Garcia** briefed the school board on the Spring 2013 state assessment results. District high school Reading, Writing, Algebra and Biology scores were above state averages. Walla Walla graduation rates, both on-time and extended, continue to be above the state average as well.

"While MSP score averages for the district are not where we want them to be, by the time they get through high school they have developed the skills they need to be career and college ready," Garcia said.

#### **Measurements of Student Progress**

#### MSP Writing:

District writing scores at the elementary and middle school levels are slightly lower than last year's scores. When compared to the state, 4<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> grade writing scores are below state average.

#### MSP Reading:

District reading scores are up or held steady in all but 5<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades, which were down somewhat from the prior year. Reading in grades 3-8 across the district was lower than the state average.

#### MSP Math:

Math scores in grades 4 and 7 increased over 2012, with 7<sup>th</sup> grade jumping almost 10 percentage points. However, results in all grade levels remain below state averages.

#### MSP Science:

Science is tested in 5<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup>. Results for 5<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade represented slight drops for the district over the prior year and are below state averages.

# Skills Center Solar Panel project

**Fred Liebrand** from WW-FREE briefed the school board on a community solar program which provides renewable energy systems on government properties.

WW-FREE is a Washington state non-profit organization which administrates the projects. The Southeast Washington Area Technical Skills Center will participate in this program and have solar panels in place when the facility opens in September. Currently, WW-FREE has solar panels installed at the WW Regional Airport and City of Walla Walla Waste Water Treatment plant.

Liebrand said many individuals are investing in these systems to receive greater tax advantages from their donations. As a result of the tax break, many are donating part or all of their investment money to provide scholarships to area students to attend college. The government entities benefit through energy cost savings and the authorization to retain the equipment at the end of the project.
