Chamber endorses levy

The Walla Walla Valley Chamber of Commerce Chief Executive Officer David Woolson reported to school board members last night the chamber board has voted to endorse the district's Educational **Programs and Operations** Replacement Levy which will appear on local ballots February 14, 2012.

"The business community recognizes that longterm economic growth is simply not possible without a strong local education system," Woolson said. "If you want to live in a strong and prosperous community with a good business climate, you have to be willing to continue to invest in that community, and one area that consistently provides a strong return on investment is education."

Rates for the replacement levy are similar to those currently being collected. Levy funding makes up approximately 20% of the district's General Fund budget.

Walla Walla Elementary school principals in the Lake Wallula Region recently selected Blue Ridge Elementary Principal **Kim Doepker** as one of 18 regional Distinguished Principals for the 2011-12 school year.

Doepker has led the development of a Dual Language (Spanish/ English) Program at Blue Ridge. This program is in its second year of implementation with a goal to eventually offer it in all grade levels. In December the district received notice Blue Ridge Elementary earned its way off the lowest achieving schools list after being on the list in 2010. Doepker and the Blue Ridge staff initiated a school improvement plan designed to better align curriculum, enhance instructional practices, coordinate focused professional development and promote high levels of family and community involvement. Doepker thanked her staff for their support and professionalism in helping the school make these impressive academic gains.

Gear Up promotes higher education
