Transportation Cooperative now hitting on all cylinders

Transportation Director Steve Olson and the team of Bus Mechanics Patrick Byrnes, Wes Polley, Bret McKinney, and Edward Czyhold are now successfully offering bus maintenance and repair service to Walla Walla Public Schools, Prescott and Dixie School Districts at the Southeast Washington Transportation Cooperative.

Olson reported to school board members last night the facility has been in operation for nearly two years. WWPS has 41 buses and 15 vans. Prescott has nine buses while Dixie has six. They also service all the lawn mowers, vans, forklifts, tractors and specialty equipment for Walla Walla Public Schools.

The cooperative saves districts approximately 50% on parts and labor.

They also do all types of troubleshooting and have all the diagnostic testing tools to do the job. Olson said operating a successful shop and operation is a team effort. Olson said bus drivers will also be supporting bullying prevention efforts by training in the Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports program.
