Bond November 2018

Wa-Hi, Pioneer and Lincoln renovations top needs list



Superintendent Wade Smith reported the district is looking at November 2018 as a potential date for a bond measure during his update last night to the school board on the progress of the Community Facilities Task Force. Renovation of Walla Walla High School, Pioneer Middle School and Lincoln High School rest at the top of the needs list. Other critical facilities needs at all district schools including roofing, HVAC, life safety improvements and communications systems are being carefully studied for possible inclusion on a bond proposal.

Superintendent Smith reported the district's existing bond debt expires in December 2018. Options being considered for a potential bond proposal by the Community Facilities Task Force include no increases to local bond rates by replacing the existing bond rate with new projects, to options which include minimal increases to local bond rates. A survey will be released next week to garner input and test if the Community Facilities Task Force is going

in the right direction regarding its needs priority list. In December, the Community Facilities Task Force will propose options to the school board for further review and community engagement.

A variety of strategies will be used throughout the winter to determine which option best meets the needs of the district and community. School board members are expected to make a final decision on a bond proposal option in May for the November 2018 General Election ballot.

Enrollment Report

Executive Director of Business Services Ted Cohan reported the first official enrollment count for the 2017-2018 school year is on target to meet the district's General Fund budget target of 5630 FTE. September enrollment figures do not include Alternative Education Program (AEP) or Running Start programs at Walla Walla Community. Enrollment counts from these WWCC programs will be tallied in the October enrollment report. Cohan said he will closely monitor enrollment figures each month.

Wa-Hi Senior Chloe Williams is serving as the Student Representative to the school board again this year. She reported on the tremendous success of FFA students at the fair, Homecoming activities and steps in place to engage more students in school activities and clubs.
