

School Board Meeting Recap | March 19, 2019

Board approves new school hours

Slight change to school hours to save district \$400,000 annually in transportation costs

Following weeks of study and input, school board members unanimously approved the Transportation/School Time Efficiency proposal which will save more than \$400,000 a year in transportation costs by adjusting and aligning school start times. All elementary schools will start at approximately 7:50 to 8 a.m. as will 1st period at Wa-Hi. Middle Schools and 2nd period Wa-Hi will begin at 8:50 a.m.

Superintendent Wade Smith conducted a Communication and Engagement Plan over the past several weeks to elicit feedback. He met with staff to discuss the proposal. The district also sent home a fact sheet to parents and created a webpage on the district's site which housed a public survey.

Superintendent Smith reviewed data from the study which included nearly 1000 completed surveys. He reported

an overwhemling majority supported the proposal now slated for implementation to start the 2019-20 school year. Transportation Director John Griffith will begin developing new bus routes and have them completed by

Elementary Consolidation and Early Learning Expansion calendar

The Walla Walla Public Schools Board of Directors continued discussion last night about their elementary consolidation and early learning expansion study. The board adopted a timeline for the study and operational understandings to help guide the process. The board will take the next eight months to complete a study addressing the issue of declining elementary enrollment and a call for more early learning opportunities. The district has lost 250 elementary students over the last nine years and is anticipating 25 empty classrooms across its six elementary campuses in the next few years.

The board's study will include site visits to elementary schools, surveys, enrollment data reviews, financial impact analysis and preschool program options. They are developing a webpage to house information about the study as a reference for staff, parents, students and stakeholders to engage.

New curriculum on pace for next school year

Krutulis reported the district is on target to adopt new High School Science and High School Algebra Geometry Algebra II curriculum later this spring. There will not be traditional textbooks for the science adoption. These materials will be digital to use on personal devices like Chromebooks. Math will use a textbook. Materials will be on display and public informational meetings are set; April 9 (Math) and April 18 (Science). The Adoption Committee is planning to bring a recommendation to the school board in May for consideration and implementation in the fall of 2019.
