# Home Visitor Update Pandemic Recovery Plan component

The district's Pandemic Recovery Plan includes enhancements to the Home Visitor Program at all schools. Last night Director of Equity and Dual Programs Dr. Julie Perron and Home Visitors Jennifer Hernandez (Green Park), Oscar Brito-Salgado (Pioneer MS), Esmeralda Pedroza (Wa-Hi) provided an update to the school board on their work

As part of the district's ESSER-funded Student Well-being plan, the School Board funded nine Home Visitors who reside at WWPS elementary schools (5), middle schools (2), and high school (2). These nine staff members deliver specialized services and supports with a main focus on home visits. During the home visits they address attendance concerns and make connections to community resources to help ensure student success.

Last night the Home Visitors reported they are making positive relationships with parents. They are helping set educational goals for each student in collaboration with parents.

### **CURRICULUM ADOPTIONS**

School board members will vote in June to adopt new K-5 science curriculum and new K-12 social emotional learning curriculum.

### BUDGET/ENROLLMENT

Fiscal Services Director Nancy Taylor reported revenues and expenditures are on target with projections. Enrollment is up 18 students from last month, but still lags behind budget projections primarily in grades K-1. Ending Fund Balance is slightly below board targets of 6 to 8 percent but is expected to rebound by the end of the year to 7%.

Board members continue planning for the 2022-2023 General Fund budget.

# **Building Belonging Recognition Award**

Last night Wa-Hi's Buddy Club and Wa-Hi Junior Miki Joshua received the district's new Building Belonging award. Director of Equity and Dual Programs Dr. Julie Perron established this award to recognize students who promote activities that create and sustain a sense of belonging, fairness. and justice for all students. The Wa-Hi Buddy Club offers opportunities for Special Education students to be part of activities supported by peers. Jennifer Butenhoff is the advisor of this program which focuses on building friendships and helping special needs students get involved in school. Miki Joshua is forming a Black Student Union for all Wa-Hi students to create a forum to learn about Black culture and history.
