Finance Officer Johnston reports enrollment decline

Chief Finance Officer Pat Johnston provided the school board an update Tuesday night on the district's 2011-2012 General Fund budget. Johnston reported the district expects to receive fewer state dollars this year than originally budgeted following a decline in enrollment this fall. Johnston said the district is witnessing enrollment declines in both general education and special education programs. Johnston said based on past trends the district estimates it will miss budget targets for enrollment by 63 students this year.

"Usually we see an increase in enrollment each October and this year we actually dropped students," Johnston reported. "We are estimating a \$623,000 revenue reduction this school year as a result of our current enrollment figures."

Johnston reported despite serving fewer students and receiving less state funding through apportionment, the district is projected to end the year with an 8.8 undesignated fund balance. She said uncertain economic times and state budget woes remain a concern.

Johnston reported the district will begin budget planning following winter break for the 2012-2013 budget. Johnston said the district will continue to closely monitor enrollment reports to determine if adjustments are necessary for next school year. She reported the district's budgeting process will remain an open and collaborative process.

Monday, January 16 is the deadline for new voters registering by mail, online, or transferring their registration/making address changes within the state of Washington.

Monday, February 6 is the deadline for people who are not registered anywhere in the state of Washington and did not meet the January 16 deadline. They are eligible to register in person at the Walla Walla County Elections Department at 310 W Poplar Street.

- Help ambassadors serve as a liaison between a local program, WSA, and the larger early learning community
- Ensure parents have a voice in policy making discussions and deliberations
- Provide WSA and the ECEAP/Head Start community with a strong grassroots network that can help move positive policy proposals forward

Responsibilities of a Parent Ambassador

- Each Parent Ambassador must be available to participate in two conference calls a month. These calls take place in the evening and are meant to share information and provide updates.
- Each Parent Ambassador is expected to attend four face-to-face trainings put together by WSA.
- Each Parent Ambassador must commit to provide “teach backs” at their policy council meetings and/or other parent meetings.
- Each Parent Ambassador is expected to participate in the legislative process by advocating for ECEAP and Head Start at the state and federal levels.
