# Step #1: Learn about

The Introduction to Unified Champion Schools for Educators is a 45 min course that increases educators understanding of the Unified Champion Schools (UCS) strategy and demonstrate its positive impact on students with and without disabilities and the ways the UCS strategy fosters socially inclusive school communities and positive school climate.

# Step #2: Develop a School Leadership Team

The first step to becoming a Unified Champion School is to bring together a team to lead the work. The leadership team is responsible for establishing the vision and overarching goals for the school, guide early stages of implementation, and ensuring fidelity to quality through consistent monitoring and nurturing with an eye toward continuous improvement.

### Step #3: Identify a School Liaison

The School Liaison is the primary contact between Special Olympics Washington and the school. The Liaison engages and empowers youth leaders to implement the 3 components of a Unified School. They are also a part of the Leadership Team!

## Step #4: Create your Plan

Identify what component your school is going to offer and create a plan to implement.
