2. Reports / Updates:

Professional Development Opportunity — Erin Dorso and Amy Reed presented a book study opportunity that will be available to district staff. They plan on reading, *Culturally Responsive Teaching and The Brain*. The study will begin second semester and limited to a small group.

Edison – **Year Two** – Julie Perron shared with the committee that the Dual Language program at Edison as a great start to the school year. Enrollment is full in both Kinder and 1^{st} grade. Next year...all sections in K - 2^{nd} grade will be dual classrooms...with a goal of continuing to add one grade per year.

Latino Outreach - Marilyn shared with the committee the following projects and/or initiatives she is working on:

- 1. The Bilingual Department met with Whitman's Bilingual United program and they agreed to continue the after school tutorial program for ELL students.
- 2. The office is working with the Technology Department to create a system where anyone in the district needing translation or interpretation services would go on-line and complete a request form.
- 3. The department was able to assist Melito Ramirez (Wa-Hi) with funding so that he could take students to Pacific Lutheran University for their Students of Color Conference.

Latino Club - Bill shared that the Latino Club had a very successful "2018 Southeast Washington Fair". Club members worked hard…both preparing the grounds and during the four days of the fair at their booth.

LEAP - The committee heard from Yasmin Buenrostro (10th) Sandra Escobedo (12) and Fatima Rodriguez (12) who are serving as Latino Education Advancement Project (LEAP) Ambassadors this year. They

travel to the Seattle area once a month and are working hard in preparation for the Annual LEAP conference in Febuary, that will draw 300-400 students from around the state.

La Cima - Kalea Soto and Adlyn Carvajal reported on the La Cima Leadership Conference they attended this summer in Randle, WA. The main purpose of the weeklong bilingual camp is to impart leadership and life skills to Latinx youth. Our Wa-Hi representatives plan to use their leadership skills to make our school an even better place for all students.

Parent Outreach - Pam reported that she is struggling with getting Latino families to register for family engagement opportunities. She did not send flyers home with students this time, but is considering doing it again. Some of the strategies she is using to increase enrollment include; reaching out to Interventions Specialists for their help, walking neighborhoods with C2C, use of social media, doing radio spots in Spanish and robo-calls. The committee offered several suggestions, including changing the name from parent classes to academy classes, passing out flyers to all 5th graders to take home and using parent ambassadors to provide testimonials.

Dia de los Muertos - Ron / Caleb – members of the Día de los Muertos committee could not attend the meeting, but sent information that the event will be held Sunday, Oct 28 from 11:00 – 4:00 pm at the Farmers Market / bus transfer station. More details will be coming.
